There are many ways parents and schools can engage to ensure every child learns and grows:



Take an active role in your child's education.

- ensure homework's complete
- sign agendas
- go through tests and assignments with your child
- read together
- seek out tutoring if needed



Become actively involved with the school.

- school council
- fundraiser society
- volunteer for field trips
- hot lunches and snack days
- help organize, set-up and takedown school events



Provide feedback through surveys.

Monitor school correspondence.

- newsletters
- websites
- social media
- note important dates on agendas and calendars
- monitor email



Connect with school staff.

- attend parent-teacher-student conferences
- meet the teachers and principal
- ask questions about programming and support
- respectfully address concerns



Prepare your child for success.

- ready to participate
- attends school regularly
- has a nutritious breakfast and lunch
- is physically and emotionally healthy
- contributes to a positive school culture

Ask questions such as:

- How can I support my child or enrich their educational experience?
- How can we work together?
- What's the best approach to assisting with my child's education?

To help facilitate parent engagement schools will:

- Keep parents well informed about student achievement, school activities and enhanced educational opportunities.
- Seek out parent feedback about changes to budgets, school plans, fees, programming and other initiatives by way of meetings and online surveys.
- Collaborate with parents about possible ways to enhance and improve their child's classroom experience.
- Ensure a welcoming, safe, caring and respectful environment in which to address concerns.

Through strong, co-operative relationships with parents, EIPS leaders are better positioned to make well-informed choices that are in the best interests of all students.
